Also in Chicago, the Libertarian Futurist Society gave its annual awards for libertarian fiction at the World Science Fiction Convention. Winning the Prometheus Award for best libertarian novel of the year was Michael Flynn, for *In the Country of the Blind*. Winning the Hall of Fame award for classic libertarian novel was F. Paul Wilson, for *An Enemy of the State*.

Congratulations to local activist Jesse Walker for receiving an honorable mention in the Institute for Humane Studies' annual Felix Morley Award contest for libertarian student journalism.
