LIBERTARIANS NOMINATE CANDIDATES FOR ANN ARBOR AND YPSILANTI CITY
COUNCIL

The Libertarian Party of Washtenaw County has broken new ground in its efforts to organize locally with the nomination of a full slate of candidates for Ann Arbor City Council and with the nomination of three candidates for Ypsilanti City Council.

On Jan 28, 1993, the Ann Arbor caucus of the Libertarian Party of Washtenaw County nominated the following candidates:

Mayor: Emily Hopp Salvette. Emily, 37 years old communications graduate student at the U-M, is a 1974 graduate of Huron High School and now lives with her husband and two sons in the Second Ward.

First Ward: Belinda Spangler. Belinda is a 21-year-old prelaw undergraduate student at U-M.

Second Ward: William Krebaum. Bill is a 39 year old project manager at an Ann Arbor engineering company.

Third Ward: Samuel Copi. Sam, 19 years, is a economics undergraduate major at U-M and a 1992 graduate of Ann Arbor Community High School

Fourth Ward: Kreg Nichols. Nichols is a U-M undergraduate.

Fifth Ward: Kent Hyne. Kent 30 years, is the owner of a construction business in Ann Arbor.

"The Libertarian full slate of candidates will concentrate on five main issues," declared Ann Arbor Libertarian Caucus chairman David Raaflaub. "(1) Stop the Brater City income tax and cut city property taxes by 15%; (2) clean-up the Ann Arbor City dump at Ellsworth road; (3) stop the City financing of the Ecology Center and Recycle Ann Arbor and thus force them to compete in the free market; (4) deregulate business and housing in Ann Arbor such that the cost of living will decrease; (5) increase personal freedom in Ann Arbor by legalizing marijuana."

Ypsilanti:

On Jan. 27, 1993 the Ypsilanti caucus of the Libertarian Party of Washtenaw County nominated the following candidates:

Second Ward: Alfredo Esposito. Fred, 36, is an assistant professor of economics at Eastern Michigan University.

Fourth Ward: Frederick Weihe. Fritz, 28 is a Research Assistant in the U-M physics department.

Fifth Ward: Gerald Kalafut. Gerald, 23, is computer programmer at a local AnnArbor corporation.

"This is an historic event. Never before has the Libertarian Party run candidates for Ypsilanti City Council. At last, there will be candidates on the ballot who will be advocating the cutting of city taxes and the promotion of economic and civil liberties in Ypsilanti," exclaimed James L. Hudler during the Ypsilanti caucus at the Spaghetti Bender restaurant.
