PEROT & "PLAIN TEXAS TALK"
(Editor's Viewpoint)

Speaking about Perot... Undeclared presidential candidate Henry Ross Perot finally declared that he would not become a declared presidential candidate, but for all of his supporters he did declare that he would still be an undeclared candidate. We do declare that Perot's campaign (at least, what there was of one) was based on a virtual vacuum where almost nothing was declared except a non-declaration vacuum, where almost nothing was declared except a non-declaration of, basically, everything. Voters must be desperate to have supported a candidate who had no principles, no convictions, no platforms, and no answers. (In more serious terms, we believe that Perot's "non-speak" allowed voters to read their own yearnings into his campaign, simply because Perot seems to share their frustration with the status quo and

has the money to potentially do something about it.)
Supporters of Perot's candidacy have said they are fed up with what Supporters of Perot's candidacy have said they are ted up with what the two older parties have done and are doing (and not doing). We think LP presidential candidate **Andre Marrou** is well equipped – with principles, convictions, plans, answers, and vision – to give Perot's former supporters what they wanted in the first place: **LESS GOVERNMENT** – less spending, less taxation, less interference. **Libertarians have always advocated cutting government waste and reducing taxation.** The Libertarian payoff? A substantially improved economy with consequent higher employment and higher standard of economy with consequent higher employment and higher standard of living. And as individuals we would regain more control over our own lives (as well as keeping an extra few hundred of our hard-earned

dollars out of government's confiscation system every single month).

We believe that the groups organized in support of Perot's campaign We believe that the groups organized in support of Perot's campaign will gradually dissipate over the next several months, especially after the November elections. The Libertarian Party has been around now for twenty years and is the third largest political party in the United States. We share the frustrations and some of the major goals of Perot supporters. We will be around after the Perot organizations have disappeared. We welcome and invite all Perot supporters to join us in our efforts to streamline government and return it to its proper role.

LPM/LPWM BOOTH AT IONIA COUNTY FREE FAIR JULY 31 – AUGUST 9 !!! 46 INQUIRIES GATHERED !!!

The LP of Michigan and the LPWM sponsored a booth at the Ionia County Free Fair, which ran from Friday, July 31, through Sunday, August 9. Booth visitors filled out a ten-question survey (the "World's Smallest Political Quiz" from Advocates For Self-Government), and booth supervisors plotted the results of each quiz on a giant two-dimensional chart showing the four quadrants "Libertarian," "Liberal," "Conservative," and "Authoritarian" (with a "Centrist" region in the middle). Visitors who were identified as libertarian were offered literature and were asked to sign up for more information about LP activities in their region. people signed up for more information, of whom 35 live in the West Michigan region (10 are elsewhere in Michigan, and 1 lives in Indiana).

This is the type of "grass roots" work that real political activity involves. Your support for the growth of the LP is vividly demonstrated

Jim has three priorities: (1) a part-time legislature, (2) local control of school boards (curriculum and funding determined solely at the local level), and (3) property tax reform that includes controls on increases in state income taxes in order to prevent state government from simply shifting rather than reducing the tax burden. HOME SCHOOLER SPEAKS OUT IN HOLLAND

The following letter written by libertarian home schooler **Mike Aernouts** was printed in the 7/2/92 issue of the **Holland Sentinel**:

Bush has stated that he would be the "education President president." Along with Education Secretary Lamar Alexander, he has come up with a plan that I think is worth getting excited about.

The "G.I. Bill for children" would create free-market-style competition among schools. A \$1,000 voucher could be used at any school to pay for education. Thats's right, any school: public, private, or parochial.

Opponents of parental choice say they fear the quality of education in this country would go down if the government no longer provided it. Nonsense. Private school pupils consistently score higher than their public school counterpart, and have been for years.

Some say that if parents are able to choose which school their children attend enrollment in public schools would greatly decline.

children attend, enrollment in public schools would greatly decline. Others say, public schools may even have to close entirely for lack of sufficient enrollment! Probably not, but free-market-style competition would economically force public schools to either compete or fall by the wayside.

As for the argument over separation of church and state, the truth is, there is no conflict. The First Amendment to the Constitution of the unere is no connict. The Hirst Amendment to the Constitution of the United States merely prohibits the government from either promoting or restricting religion. The government's only function should be to protect the rights of its citizenry. It should not be in the business of teaching. Furthermore, as long as the voucher equals or is less than the amount normally spent anyway, there is no conflict. No increase in tax dollars would occur, and there would be freedom of choice!

Parents should have the right to choose the school their tax dollars go to. Parental choice is a realistic solution to the problems facing the

educational system in America today.

WILL YOUR VOTE COUNT IN NOVEMBER?

(AN EDITORIAL)

If you vote for Bush or Clinton, your vote will count for nothing. It's really that simple. Both of the older parties have been saying "If you want change, vote for us!" for decades. The phrase is now nothing more want change, vote for decades. The pirace is now noting more than a bad joke. That anyone would take either of them seriously can only be measured on the scale of gullibility. Neither of these two conventional parties have given us the change that they constantly promise. It does not matter whether you have a donkey or an elephant for president, what you get is higher taxes, increased government spending, and more government intrusions in our public and private lives dictating what we can and cannot do with our own money, our own property, and our own bodies.

This is the reality: A vote for Bill or George is a vote for more government and more taxes. If you vote for either of those two, you will have cast your vote into the cesspool of status quo, and you will have only yourself to blame. The records of their parties stand clear, and only those who are blind and who have terminally short memories can vote for George or Bill knowing that they represent the two older parties.

Some people are thinking, "Why should I vote for Andre Marrou? There's no way that he is going to win." These people are missing the whole point of what voting is all about. They think that voting is like a boxing match where you put your money on who you think is going to be

the winner. They are wrong!

Your vote does only one thing: it sends a signal regarding the ideas you support. If you don't vote for Andre Marrou (or any candidate other than Bill and George), you are assured of achieving no change whatsoever. If you vote for George or Bill, the signal that you are sending is, "You Republicans and Democrats are doing fine. Give me more of the same." Is that what you really want to do with your vote Throw it away on their hypocrisy and never-to-be-kept promises?

If you support the idea of more government and higher taxes by all means vote for Bill or George. But if you support individual liberty and individual rights, then make your vote really count: Vote to Andre Marrou.
