#### **Barnes Edged Out In Education Race**

Diane Barnes was barely defeated in her race for East Detroit Board of Education on November 2. In a five way race for two positions Barnes finished third, beating out one incumbent and one challenger. Her 2,097 votes were just 156 short of election.

Her last minute decision to run was followed by a brisk campaign that featured personal appearances, door-to-door work, a 7,000-piece mailing and ads in newspapers. A last minute "hit piece" by an opponent complained that she is a "Libertarian" and that she favored privatizing the schools. Diane says she "appreciates the plug."

Barnes has built a base of name recognition for the next election and with an earlier start could win.

#### **Racchi Fourth In Roseville**

Rosemary Racchi finished fourth in a four way race against three incumbents for the Roseville City Council on November 2 with 1,887 votes to 2,607 for her nearest rival. Racchi focused on two mailings to absentee voters, but was not well enough financed to do a mailing to the entire district. She appealed to seniors and women, but that was not enough.

#### **Mike Corliss Goes For Senate**

Michael Corliss of Westland announced he will run for the US Senate nomination of the LPM. He told his Liberty Fest audience on November 6 that he plans a very active campaign. He is a teacher and an accomplished speaker.

#### **Liberty Fest Honors Six**

Five Defender of Liberty Awards were made to six honorees at the fourth annual Liberty Fest Banquet at Heintzman's Heidelberg Restaurant in Clinton Township November 6, before 78 attendees.

The first award for Producer of Liberty for behind – the-scenes hard work went to LPM and Macomb County Membership Chair Mark Heil for his work in those jobs, website creation and other technological advances over the years. Also receiving a Statue of Liberty for that category were Al Titran and Rosemary Racchi for their dedicated work on many projects that others may shun. Stacy Van Oast was the presenter.

A promoter of Liberty award for advancing the Libertarian Party and its principles went to Emily Salvette for her many years of leadership in the Oakland and Washtenaw counties, her work as Affiliates Director and her two terms as State Chair.

Earning the Spokesperson for Liberty award for a member of the community whose patriotism and conviction have been inspiring was Comerica Vice President and Chief Economist David Littmann. His many articles and interviews have spread the ideas of liberty to the general public.

Author James Bovard ("Freedom in Chains" and "Lost Rights") was the keynote speaker. He said the battle is not between liberalism and conservatism, but against statism. He focused on the Waco tragedy and its recent rebirth as an issue, casting doubt on the objectivity of the current investigation.

The fundraising appeal was handled by Michael Corliss, who also announced his candidacy for the US Senate nomination.

#### LPM Launches Press Release Capability

The new web-based data entry system for building and maintaining a media database has been launched with the transmission of the LPM's first mass broadcast press release.

Computer superstar and Indiana transplant Greg Dirasian and fellow technoguru Hugh Fader have created the new utility that has greatly expanded the party's capabilities. The dramatically upgraded system can transmit press releases to nearly 400 media outlets of all types by any criteria desired (such a print or broadcast only, all media within a designated area, etc.) The new database can be updated by anyone with access to the web and a password. Darryl Schmitz of Saint Johns to distribute Tim O'Brien's op-ed columns to approximately 75 newspapers across the state. Darryl retains primary responsibility for distribution.

"A lot of people helped with all the data entry," said Executive Committee member and prime mover behind the enhanced capability, Nancy O'Brien. "I'm really grateful for all the help in what was a very tedious job."

The system got it's first real-world test in the distribution of a press release (all media throughout the state) announcing the LPM's radio and web-based petition lobbying effort to change Michigan's "Concealed Carry" laws to what is called the "Shall issue" system. That would put the burden of proof back on government to show why the applicant ought to be denied.

#### **Atlas Shrugged Heads To TNT**

New York (Variety) – TNT is developing Ayn Rand's classic 1957 novel "Atlas Shrugged" as a four hour miniseries, the cable network announced Wednesday. The novel centers around Dagny Taggert, a woman who confronts bureaucracy in her job as manager of a transcontinental railroad; and John Galt, a man who attempts to stop the world.. "Atlas Shrugged" is largely viewed as the most complete fictional presentation of objectivism, Rand's personal philosophy.

Somehow, I managed to read two wonderful books over the summer. One, "Rabble in Arms" by Kenneth Roberts, (recommended to me by Keith Edwards) is a terrific, historically accurate novel about the northern battles of the American Revolution. The group of "rabble" that the story revolves around immediately becomes any libertarian's friends. They denounce paper money, they are true freedom fighters and they have nothing good to say about the leadership in Congress. Minutes of the previous meeting were approved as corrected. The reference to affiliates or members providing the LEC with a proposal and timeline refers to State LPM meetings only.

Chair report by Stacy Van Oast covered general areas of expansion and financing.

Executive Director report by Tim O"Brien covered the radio ads program beginning Oct. 1, two ads on conceal carry. Mailing list exchange with ACLU is about done. Speak out Michigan web page is functioning. There will be a 400-piece mailing to recent expired members. There will be another premium offer to aid recruitment, the new Waco tape.

Vice Chair report by Teresa Pollok covered New affiliate in Allegan Co., revival of Traverse City group and the startup in St. Clair Co. Allegan was formally recognized as an official affiliate by unanimous vote.

#### Speak Out, Michigan

The LPM has launched a new web-based petitioning program called SpeakOutMichigan.org to make it more convenient for members and everyone else who is of a mind to join us to lobby our state legislature.

Anyone with access to the internet can go to SpeakOutMichigan.org, enter his name and home address and instantly send a letter to both his state rep and state senator. The system is designed to automatically determine who his legislators are from the zip code he enters. Users may either write their own letter, use the pre-written one we have provided, or a combination of the two starting with our basic letter and modifying it as they see fit.

#### Modeled on the very successful

Defend Your Privacy.com site which the National LP created to lobby against the Orwellian "Know Your Customer" bank spying proposal by the FDIC, our SpeakOutMichigan site was created by LPM web wiz, Greg Dirasian, who is also primarily responsible for both our weekly on-line e-newsletter and our new webased press release system.

Ours is only the second state LP affiliate in the country to have created such a utility. The other state was California with its 215Now site dedicated to getting their state government to actually enforce the medical marijuana initiative passed by the state's voters.

SpeakOutMichigan is unique in its flexibility. Both the national and California sites are single issue. Ours can easily be modified to lobby for or against whatever new issues arise in Lansing.

The inaugural effort, also promoted by a two-week radio schedule at stations across the state, was to push our balky public officials to bring our state in line with most of the rest of the country by giving us a "Shall Issue" system for concealed carry permits.

Though sponsored by the LPM with a link to our homepage, the site itself is non-partisan in that anyone can use it and may select from a list of party designations, if they so desire. As of the beginning of November, SpeakOutMichigan had been used by 225 Republicans, 166 Libertarians, 19 Democrats, 14 Reformers and 9 US Taxpayers. Seven claimed affiliation with the Conservative Party (which only exists in New York.) There were 303 who "Prefer Not to Say," 123 Independent and 2 who checked "Not Registered to Vote." The total number of people who had used the site was 868, from 67 different counties, topped by Oakland 154, Wayne 128, Macomb 81, Kent 60 and Genesee 50. All 110 state reps received e-mails including 852 to Republicans and 530 to Democrats.

We expect to switch over to another issue soon so if you want to tell your legislators to uphold Article I, Section 6 of our state constitution, do so now.

The text of the basic letter follows.

#### Dear [Official's Name],

I am writing you today to urge you to introduce, support and actively work to pass a law here in Michigan that will permit me to carry the means to defend myself and my family, my friends, neighbors and fellow citizens from criminals and psychopaths.

The effect of the current law has been that we who are law-abiding are left defenseless and the only private citizens who are armed are the criminals and the mentally unbalanced – the very ones from whom we need protection!

Thirty-one of the 50 states have already recognized these facts and returned to the tradition of "innocent until proved guilty" by adopting a "Shall Issue" policy requiring government to show why a person applying for a permit should be denied. They have put the burden of proof back where it belongs.

And our own Michigan constitution (which you have sworn an oath to defend says: "Every person has the right to keep and bear arms for the defense of himself and the state."

If you believe that "gun control" will somehow make me safer that being permitted to carry the means to defend myself, I urge you to re-examine the evidence And reconsider your position.
